AUTHORIZING AND EMPOWERING THE CITY TREASURER OF THE CITY OF PITTS-
TON TO EMPLOY THE CLERKS NECESSARY FOR THE PROPER CONDUCT OF HIS
OFFICE AND FOR THE ACCOMODATION OF THE PUBLIC AND FIXING THE
AMOUNT OF MONEY HE SHALL BE ALLOWED BY THE CITY FOR THE PAYMENT
OF THE SALARIES OF THE SAID CLERKS AND REPEALING THE ORDINANCE
CREATING THE OFFICES OF DEPUTY CITY TREASURER AND CITY TREAS-
URER'S CLERK, AND ABOLISHING THE SAID OFFICE.

- 1 Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Council of the City of Pittston, and it is hereby
- 2 enacted and ordained by authority of the same:
- 3 That the City Treasurer be and is hereby authorized and empowered to employ the Clerks
- 4 necessary for the proper conduct of his office and for the accommodation of the public.
- 5 Section 2. That the ordinance creating the offices of Deputy City Treasurer and City Treas-
- 6 .urer's Clerk be and is hereby repealed and the said offices abolished.
- 7 Section 3. That the City, in accordance with the appropriation made in the appropriation ord-
- 8 inance, for Clerk hire for the City Treasurer pay to the Clerk or Clerks employed by said City
- 9 Treasurer the amount certified in writing to the City Clerk by the said City Treasurer semi-
- 10 monthly, but the said Clerk hire shall not amount to more than the sum of Fourteen Hundred
- 11 Forty (\$1440) Dollars annually.
- 12 Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

REPORTED FROM THE COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE MAR. 3, 1916.

AN ORDINANCE

PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A TRUNK SEWER COMMENCING AT A POINT AT THE NORTHERLY END OF A TRUNK SEWER NOW ON PRICE STREET AND THENCE IN A NORTHERLY AND WESTERLY DIRECTION TO A JUNCTURE WITH THE CULVERT ON TOMPKINS STREET AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSE OF THE SAME.

1 Section 1. Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Pittston and it is hereby ordained by
2 the authority of the same:

3 That a Trunk Sewer be constructed, commencing at a point at the Northerly end of a trunk
4 sewer now on Price Street and thence in a Northerly and Westerly direction to a juncture with
5 the culvert on Tompkins Street, in said City, under the direction of the City Engineer, and accord-
6 ing to plans, profile and specifications prepared by him, and filed in his office, a copy of which is
7 hereto attached.

8 Section 2. Upon the passage of this ordinance the City Clerk shall advertise for sealed pro-
9 posals to do the work as provided in Section 1 of this ordinance. Proposals shall state separately
10 the price per lineal foot for building the same, and shall cover the entire work. Bidders shall
11 enclose with each proposal the sum of One Hundred Dollars cash or certified check, as a guaran-
12 tee to execute a contract withint wenty days for the work if awarded the same. Council may
13 award the contract. In case the bidder to whom the contract shall have been awarded omits to
14 execute a contract within twenty days from the date of award, the enclosure accompanying his
15 proposal shall be forfeited to the City of Pittston. The City reserves the right to reject any and
16 all bids. The Mayor and City Clerk shall execute the contract on behalf of the City, attested by
17 the corporate seal. Upon the execution of the contract, the contractor shall deliver to the City
18 his bond in the sum of Two Thousand (\$2000) Dollars with sureties to be approved by the City
19 Solicitor, payable to the City, and conditioned for the faithful performance of the work, and for
20 the payment of all just claims for all labor performed or material furnished for or on account of
21 said contract, as the same shall become due.

22 Section 3. For the purpose of defraying the expense of this contract there is hereby appro-
23 priated the sum of Six Thousand (\$6000) Dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary from the
24 \$50,000 issue of 4½ % City Improvement Bonds.

PROVIDING FOR THE INSTALLATION OF A POLICE CALL SYSTEM IN THE CITY OF
PITTSTON AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSE OF THE SAME.

1 Section 1. Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Pittston, and it is hereby ordained by
2 the authority of the same:

3 That the Council advertise for and receive sealed proposals for the installation of a Police Call
4 System for the use of the Police Department, with all the necessary batteries and articles requisite
5 for the complete and perfect operation of the said system.

6 Section 2. That the work of construction and installation shall be done in accordance with
7 plans and specifications now on file in the City Engineer's office, a copy of which is hereto
8 attached, and that the entire work shall be done under directions of the City Engineer and City
9 Electrician.

10 Section 3. For the purpose of defraying the expense of this contract there is hereby appro-
11 priated the sum of Three Thousand (\$3000) Dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary from
12 the \$50,000 issue of 4½ % City Improvement Bonds.

AN ORDINANCE

PROVIDING FOR THE PURCHASE OF TWO MOTOR FIRE TRUCKS FOR THE USE OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS TO MEET THE EXPENSE OF THE SAME.

1 Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Council of the City of Pittston, and it is hereby
2 enacted and ordained by authority of the same:

3 That the City of Pittston purchase two (2) motor fire trucks for the use of the Fire Depart-
4 ment therein; said motor trucks to conform to the specifications on file in the office of the City
5 Clerk a copy of which is hereto attached.

6 Section 2. Upon the passage of this ordinance the City Clerk shall advertise for sealed pro-
7 posals for prices of said trucks. Bidders shall enclose with each proposal the sum of \$100 cash
8 or certified check as a guarantee to execute a contract within twenty days if awarded the same.

9 Section 3. For the purpose of purchasing said motor trucks there is hereby appropriated the
10 sum of \$9000 or so much thereof as may be necessary from the \$50,000 issue of 4½ per cent. City
11 Improvement Bonds.

REPORTED FROM COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE, MARCH 3, 1916

AN ORDINANCE

PROVIDING FOR THE PAVING OF DEFOE STREET, BETWEEN WILLIAM STREET AND BUTLER STREET; PROVIDING FOR THE SETTING OR RE-SETTING OF CURB STONE WHERE NECESSARY ON SAID STREET; DIRECTING MANNER OF ASSESSING AND COLLECTING COSTS OF SAID IMPROVEMENT, AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE COSTS AND EXPENSES THEREOF.

1 Section 1. Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Pittston and it is hereby ordained by
2 the authority of the same: That Defoe Street, from William Street to Butler Street in the Sev-
3 enth Ward of the City of Pittston, be graded and curbed and paved with a Vitrified Hill Brick
4 and Wood Block or National Pave Product, on a concrete foundation, and that the necessary
5 curbing be constructed along both sides of said street, between the points aforesaid. All of
6 said work shall be done within sixty days after the execution of the contract made in pursuance
7 hereof, and under the directions of the Superintendent of Streets and Public Improvements and
8 the City Engineer, and according to plans, profile and specifications prepared by him and filed in
9 his office, copies of which are hereto attached; excepting, however, as the same may be modified
10 by the provisions of this ordinance.

11 Section 2. Where new curbing is required, or old curbing re-set, the same shall be done by the
12 City under the contract hereinafter provided for, and the costs thereof collected according to the
13 assessment hereinafter provided.

14 Section 3. Upon the passage of this ordinance, and the completion of the assessment for said
15 improvement as hereinafter provided for, the City Clerk shall advertise for sealed proposals to
16 do the said paving and curbing as provided in sections 1 and 2 of this ordinance. Proposals shall
17 cover the entire work and shall state separately the price for setting and re-setting curb stones,
18 and the price for paving per square yard, which is to include costs of grading as shown on the
19 profile of said improvement in the office of the City Engineer. Bidders shall enclose with each
20 proposal the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) cash or certified check, as a guarantee to ex-
21 ecute a contract within twenty days for the work, if awarded the same. Councils may award the
22 contract. In case the bidder to whom the contract shall have been awarded omits to execute a
23 contract within twenty days from the date of award, the enclosure accompanying his proposal
24 shall be forfeited to the City of Pittston. The City reserves the right to reject any and all bids.
25 The Mayor and the City Clerk shall execute the contract on behalf of the City, attested by the
26 corporate seal. Upon the execution of the contract the contractor shall deliver to the City his
27 bond in the sum of Two Thousand (\$2,000) Dollars, with sureties to be approved by the City
28 Solicitor, payable to the City and conditioned for the faithful performance of the contract, and
29 for the payment of all just claims for all labor performed or material furnished for or on account
30 of said contract, as they shall become due.

31 Section 4. Immediately upon the passage of this ordinance, the City Engineer shall make the as-
32 sessment for two thirds of said pavement against the owners of real estate bounding and abutting
32 on said street, between the points named, by an equal assessment on said property in proportion
34 to the number of feet the same fronts on said street, between the points named, and for the
35 curbing by the lineal foot against owners of property abutting on said part of said street,
36 giving notice to said owners of the time and place of making such assessments, as provided by
37 law. The other one third of said grading and paving to be paid by the City.

38 Section 5. Immediately after the completion of said work, the City Engineer shall file in the
39 office of the City Clerk, and in the office of the City Treasurer, a final or correct schedule of said
40 assessment.



41 Section 6. Said assessment shall be payable in thirty days after the completion of the work, and
42 shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum, commencing from the date the same
43 shall fall due.

44 Section 7. The commencement and completion of the work, as specified in this ordinance, shall
45 be the date when the work, under proper contract is commenced, and when the same is completed;
46 and it shall be the duty of the City Engineer to certify to the City Clerk and the City Treasurer
47 the date of the commencement of said work and its completion, which certificate shall remain
48 on file for the inspection of the public.

49 Section 8. Immediately after the completion of said work, the City Engineer shall certify the
50 schedule of assessment to the City Treasurer, who shall notify the owners or reputed owners by
51 mail of the amount of the assessment, and the terms of payment, upon which notice shall be
52 printed this section of this ordinance. If said assessment shall remain unpaid after the same shall
53 become due said assessment shall immediately be certified to the City Solicitor for collection ac-
54 cording to law.

55 Section 9. On the completion of the work the contractor shall be paid in accordance with the
56 terms set forth in the specifications provided he shall have executed the bond as provided in Sec-
57 tion 3, hereof.

58 Section 10. For the purpose of defraying the expense of this contract there is hereby appropri-
59 ated the sum of Three Thousand (\$3,000.00) Dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary
60 from the \$50,000.00 issue of 4½ per cent. City Improvement Bonds.

AN ORDINANCE

PROVIDING FOR THE GRADING, CURBING AND PAVING OF DOCK STREET FROM MAIN STREET TO THE LEHIGH VALLEY RAILROAD TRACKS IN THE NINTH WARD OF THE CITY OF PITSTON, DIRECTING THE MANNER OF ASSESSMENT AND THE COLLECTION OF THE COSTS OF SAID IMPROVEMENT, AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE SAME.

1 Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Council of the City of Pittston, and it is hereby
2 enacted and ordained by authority of the same:

3 That Dock Street, from Main Street to the Lehigh Valley Railroad Tracks in the Ninth Ward,
4 of the City of Pittston, be graded and curbed and paved with a vitrified brick on a concrete found-
5 ation, and that the necessary curbing be constructed along both sides of said street, between the
6 points aforesaid.

7 Section 2. That the City Engineer be and is hereby directed to have plans and specifications
8 prepared for the grading, curbing and paving herein authorized, and that the same be attached
9 to this ordinance before final passage in Councils.

10 Section 3. Immediately upon the passage of this ordinance the City Engineer shall make the
11 assessment for two thirds of said pavement against the owners of real estate bounding and abut-
12 ting on said street, between the points named, by an equal assessment on said property in propor-
13 tion to the number of feet the same fronts on said street, between the points named, and for the
14 curbing by the lineal foot against owners of property abutting on said part of said street, giving
15 notice to said owners of the time and place of making such assessments, as provided by law. The
16 other one third of said grading and paving to be paid by the City.

17 Section 4. Immediately after the completion of said work, the City Engineer shall file in the
18 office of the City Clerk, and in the office of the City Treasurer, final or correct schedule of said
19 assessment.

29 Section 5 The assessment for the grading, curbing and paving heretofore mentioned shall
30 become due immediately upon the completion of the same.

31 Section 6. The City Treasurer shall, upon receipt of the final and corrected schedule afore-
32 said, notify the owners or reputed owners by mail of the amount of the assessment and the
33 terms of payment in accordance with law, and if the said assessment shall remain unpaid 60 days after
34 the same shall become due, said assessment shall be immediately certified by the City Treas-
35 uer to the City Solicitor for collection according to law.

36 Section 7. Upon the passage of this ordinance the City Clerk shall advertise for sealed pro-
37 posals for said grading, curbing and paving as provided in Sections 1 and 2 of this ordinance.
38 Proposals shall cover the entire work and shall state separately the price for paving per square
39 yard, which is to include the grading as shown on profile of said improvement on file in the of-
40 fice of the City Engineer together with the cost per foot for curbing or resetting of curb. Bid-
41 ders shall enclose with each proposal the sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars cash or certified
42 check as a guarantee to execute a contract within twenty days from the date of award, or money
43 or check shall be forfeited to the City of Pittston. The City reserves the right to reject any or
44 all bids. The Mayor and City Clerk shall execute the contract on behalf of the City, attested
45 by the corporate seal. Upon the execution of a contract the contractor shall deliver to the City
46 his bond in the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000) Dollars with sureties to be approved by the City
47 Solicitor, payable to the City and conditioned for the faithful performance of the contract and
48 for the payment of all just claims, for all labor performed or material furnished for or on account
49 of said contract as the same shall become due.

50 Section 8. When the paving and curbing of said portion of Dock street above mentioned
51 shall be completed according to said specifications, the City Engineer shall certify in writing
52 the fact of such completion, and file such certificate with the City Clerk, and thereupon the
53 Council shall, by resolution, accept said paving and curbing, and the contractor therefore shall
54 be paid within sixty days after the completion and acceptance the full contract price for
55 paving, grading and curbing; less ten per cent. thereof which will be withheld for six months after
56 the completion of the contract for repairs to the Street, etc., as provided in specifications aforesaid.

70 Section 9. Immediately after the expiration of the sixty days aforesaid, allowed for the
71 payment of the first installment due thereon, the City Treasurer shall return to the City Solic-
72 itor the amounts of all installments of payments remaining unpaid, together with the names of
73 the abutters against whom the same is chargeable. The City Solicitor shall, within six months
74 from the completion of the improvement in front of said properties, file liens against the abut-
75 ters for the unpaid installments in the manner prescribed by law, with a penalty of three per
76 centum chargeable thereon in case the same is collected by legal proceedings.

57 Section 10. For the purpose of defraying the expense of this contract there is hereby appropri-
58 ated the sum of \$4,100.00 or so much thereof as may be necessary from the \$50,000.00 issue of
59 4½ per cent. City Improvement Bonds.

5 after the execution of the contract made in pursuance hereof, and under the direction of the City
6 Engineer, and according to plans, profiles and specifications prepared by him and filed in his office,
7 a copy of which is hereto attached; excepting, however, as the same may be modified by the pro-
8 visions of this ordinance.

9 Section 2. Upon the passage of this ordinance the City Clerk shall advertise for sealed proposals
10 for the construction of said sewer and house connections as provided in Section 1 of this ordinance.
11 Proposals shall cover the total cost of entire work and shall state separately the price per lineal foot,
12 both in writing and in figures, for the work herein provided for. Bidders shall enclose with each
13 proposal the sum of (\$100) dollars cash or certified check, as a guarantee to execute a contract
14 within twenty days for the work, if awarded the same. Council may award the contract. In
15 case the bidder to whom the contract shall have been awarded omits to execute a contract within
16 twenty days from the date of award, the enclosure accompanying his proposal shall be forfeited

27 Section 3. Immediately upon the passage of this ordinance the City Engineer shall make the
28 assessment for two-thirds of said lateral sewer against the owners of real estate bounding and
29 abutting on said street, between the points named, by an equal assessment on said property in
30 proportion to the number of feet the same fronts on said street, between the points named, giving
31 notice to said owners of the time and place of making such assessments, as provided by law.
32 The other one-third of said lateral sewer to be paid by the City.

33 Section 4. Immediately after the completion of said work, the City Engineer shall file in the
34 office of the City Clerk and in the office of the City Treasurer a final or correct schedule of said
35 assessment.

36 Section 5. Said assessment shall be payable in thirty days after the completion of the work, and
37 shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum, commencing from the date the same shall
38 fall due.

39 Section 6. The commencement and the completion of the work, as specified in the ordinance,
40 shall be the date when the work under proper contract is commenced and when the same is com-
41 pleted; and it shall be the duty of the City Engineer to certify to the City Clerk and the City Treas-
42 urer the date of the commencement of said work, and the date of its completion, which certificate
43 shall remain on file for the inspection of the public.

44 Section 7. Immediately after the completion of said work the City Engineer shall certify the
45 schedule of assessments to the City Treasurer, who shall notify the owners or reputed owners by
46 mail of the amount of their assessments and terms of payment upon which notices shall be printed
47 this section of this ordinance. If said assessments shall remain unpaid after the same shall be-
48 come due said assessments shall immediately be certified to the City Solicitor for collection ac-
49 cording to law.

51 Section 8. On the completion of the work the contractor shall be paid in accordance with the
52 terms set forth in the specifications provided he shall have executed the bond as provided in Sec-
53 tion 2 hereof.

54 Section 9. For the purpose of defraying the expense of this contract there is hereby appropriated
55 the sum of \$500 or so much thereof as may be necessary from the \$50,000.00 issue of 4½ per cent.
56 City Improvement Bonds.

1 Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Council of the City of Pittston, and it is hereby
2 enacted and ordained by authority of the same:

3 That a lateral sewer be constructed on Tompkins Street from Dock Street to East Street in said
4 City, and that house connections be constructed from said lateral sewer to the curb line; all of said
5 work shall be done within thirty days after the execution of the contract made in pursuance hereof,
6 and under the direction of the City Engineer, and according to plans, profiles and specifications
7 prepared by him and filed in his office, a copy of which is hereto attached; excepting, however, as
8 the same may be modified by the provisions of this ordinance.

9 Section 2. Upon the passage of this ordinance the City Clerk shall advertise for sealed proposals
10 for the construction of said sewer and house connections as provided in Section 1 of this ordinance.
11 Proposals shall cover the total cost of entire work and shall state **separately** the price per lineal foot,
12 both in writing and in figures, for the work herein provided for. Bidders shall enclose with each
13 proposal the sum of (\$100) dollars cash or certified check, as a guarantee to execute a contract
14 within twenty days for the work, if awarded the same. Council may award the contract. In
15 case the bidder to whom the contract shall have been awarded omits to execute a contract within
16 twenty days from the date of award, the enclosure accompanying his proposal shall be forfeited
17 to the City of Pittston. The City of Pittston reserves the right to reject any or all bids.

1 Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Council of the City of Pittston, and it is hereby
2 enacted and ordained by authority of the same:

3 That the indebtedness of the City of Pittston be, and the same is hereby increased Fifty Thous-
4 and Dollars, for the purposes hereinafter enumerated and set forth.

5 Section 2. That said increase of indebtedness shall be funded by an issue of coupon bonds in
6 sums of One Thousand Dollars each, bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent. per

1 Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Council of the City of Pittston, and it is hereby
2 enacted and ordained by authority of the same:

3 That the office of Superintendent of Recreation be and is hereby created. It shall be the duty
4 of the Superintendent of Recreation to have charge, under the direction and authority of the Super-
5 intendent of Parks, of all matters and things pertaining to the Parks,
5½ and to such other matters or things pertaining to the Department of Parks or to the athletic
6 training of the children of the City, as shall be assigned to him by the Superintendent of Parks.
7 The said Superintendent of Recreation shall supervise all apparatus and paraphernalia in the
8 different Parks and Playgrounds and shall at all times use extreme care in the prevention of any
9 accidents to the children or other persons frequenting the recreation grounds of the City. He
10 shall take charge of any athletic events, or training of children of the City, held or done in any
11 place other than the said Parks and Playgrounds, whenever directed to do so by the Superintend-
12 ent of Parks.

13 Section 2. The term of office of the Superintendent of Recreation shall be one year and five
14 months, commencing on the first day of April, 1916, and ending on the last day of August, 1917.

15 Section 3. The salary of the said official shall be and is hereby fixed as follows: for the months
16 of April and May, 1916, \$37.50 per month, payable semi-monthly; for the remainder of the term of
17 office at the rate of \$62.50 per month payable semi-monthly.

18 Section 4. For the purpose of paying the salary of the said Superintendent of Recreation for the
19 year ending April 1, 1917, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$700.00 from the fund appropri-
20 ated for Parks and Playgrounds.

21 Section 5. This ordinance is declared to be urgent and necessary for the immediate preservation
22 of the public peace, health and safety, and shall take effect and be in force from and after its pas-
23 sage and publication as provided by law.

LEVYING GENERAL AND SPECIAL TAXES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1919.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Pittston, and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same.

That for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the City of Pittston for the fiscal year of 1919 and certain deficiencies prior thereto, a tax is hereby levied on all persons, occupations, real, personal and mixed property, within the limits of the City of Pittston, taxable according to the laws of the State of Pennsylvania, for County purposes as follows:

To provide a Sinking Fund for the liquidation of \$26,000 four per cent. City Improvements Bonds, issue of the year 1901, there is hereby levied four-tenths of one mill on the dollar of valuation.

To provide a Sinking Fund for the liquidation of \$70,000 four and one half per cent. City Improvement Bonds, issue of the year 1909, there is hereby levied eight-tenths of one mill on the dollar of valuation.

To provide a Sinking Fund for the liquidation of \$26,300 five per cent. City Improvement Bonds, issue of the year 1915, there is hereby levied four-tenths of one mill on the dollar of valuation.

To provide a Sinking Fund for the liquidation of \$39,000 four and one half per cent. City Improvement Bonds, issue of the year 1916, there is hereby levied three tenths of one mill on the dollar of valuation.

To provide for general revenue purposes and for the payment of loans to support the City, and to make necessary improvements, there is hereby levied six and one-tenth mills on the dollar of valuation.

Section 2. That for the purpose of general revenue for the fiscal year 1919 a poll tax of one dollar is hereby imposed and levied on all male inhabitants of the City above the age of twenty-one (21) years.

7 Section 2. That the City Engineer be and is hereby directed to have plans and specifications
8 prepared for the grading curbing and paving herein authorized, and that the same be attached
9 to this ordinance before final passage in Councils.

10 Section 3. That for the purpose of defraying the expense of said paving, grading and curbing
15 and incidental expenses, the several properties fronting upon and adjacent to the said portion
16 of Church St. be and the same are hereby assessed for contribution thereto, that is to say, each of

AN ORDINANCE

PROVIDING FOR THE FILING OF MAPS OR PLANS OF ANY OR ALL MINING OF COAL OR OTHER MINERALS UNDER THE SURFACE OF THE LAND WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF PITTSSTON, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the council of the City of Pittston, and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same, that from and after the passage of this ordinance, every person, firm or corporation being the owner or lessee of any coal lands within the limits of the City of Pittston, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania, and engaged in the mining and removing of any coal or other minerals in any of the seams, beds or veins of coal or parts thereof from any land below the surface of said land, within the limits of the boundaries of the City of Pittston, County of Luzerne, and State of Pennsylvania, before making any opening for any new shaft, slope or drift or before making any extension or addition of any old shaft, slope or drift to said seams, beds or veins of coal or other minerals so lying within the limits of the said city, shall first file a plan or draft of the said proposed opening, shaft, slope or drift or the extension or addition of any old shaft, slope or drift with the City Clerk of the said City, which plan and draft shall contain a full and accurate description of the said new shaft, slope or drift, or any extension or addition of any old slope, shaft, or drift, its width and breadth and depth to which it is proposed to drive the same, the character and nature of the ground, earth and soil and rocks through which the said slope, shaft or drift is to be driven, the thickness of the veins of coal or other minerals through which the same shall pass and the purpose and use for which said shaft, slope or drift is being made. The said plan or draft and map shall be signed by the said person or persons, or the principal officers of said firm or corporation, and shall contain a certificate verified by an affidavit as to the truth of the statements therein contained, and shall be on file at least sixty days before any disturbance of the said surface or work on the said new or extension and addition to the said old shaft, slope or drift shall be made.

Section 2. That all persons, firms or corporations, being the owners or lessees of any coal or other minerals, and now is, and hereafter shall be engaged in the mining and removal of any of the said coal or other minerals, from any of the lands within the limits of the boundaries of the City of Pittston, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania, shall, after the passage of this ordinance, file with the City Clerk of the City of Pittston, a map and plan of any proposed new, or any extension of any old tunnel, gangway, airway, roadway or heading, or other opening beneath the surface of the said land intended to be used in the mining, and removal of said coal or other minerals lying within the limits of the said City which draft or map and plan shall contain a full and detailed description of the proposed new or extension of any old tunnel, gangway, airway, roadway, heading or passageway in and through said veins of coal, or other minerals or earth or rocks, which plan or map shall show the place where the said tunnel, gangway, airway, roadway, heading or other opening shall start and where it is proposed to end, showing the height, depth and length of the same, the distance the same will be below the surface of the said land, the nature and character of the rocks and earth which lies between the said tunnel, gangway, airway, heading, roadway or passageway in and to the said veins of coal or other minerals AND THE SURFACE OF THE EARTH SO FAR AS POSSIBLE, showing also a map of the surface and the relative direction the same shall occupy on the surface of the land within the limits of the said City, and showing the streets, alleys, lands, courts, thoroughfares and public parks the same shall cross under, and also shall show a complete list of the number and sizes of the pillars of coal or other minerals which it is proposed to leave for purpose of supporting the said surface, and if any, what other provisions it is proposed shall be made, or means shall be taken to support the sur-

face of the land within the limits of the said City through which the said tunnel, or tunnels, gangway or gangways, airway or airways, heading or headings, roadways or passageways shall be driven. The said map, plan or draft shall contain a certificate signed by the person or persons or the principal officers of the firm or corporation filing the same, which certificate shall contain an affidavit as to the truth of the statements therein contained, that the said gangway, tunnel, airway, roadway, heading or passageway beneath the surface of the said land when completed within the limits of the said City of Pittston, shall not be injurious to the interests of the said City, and will not in any way injure any PUBLIC PARK, Lane, Court, Street, Avenue or Thoroughfare, WITHIN THE LIMITS OF SAID CITY, and the said map or plan as aforesaid shall be on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Pittston sixty days before any work or operation on the said tunnel, gangway, passageway, heading or roadway, or airway shall be begun in said mine.

Section 3. Six months from the date of filing the proper plan, map or draft of the said proposed work or operation with the City Clerk on any tunnel, slope or drift, or any gangway, airway, roadway or passageway or any heading in and to any mines or seams of coal underneath the surface of the said land within the City of Pittston, and every six months thereafter the parties filing said plans, their heirs, successors or assigns, or lessees, or legal representatives, shall file with the City Clerk of said City, a map of the said working within the said slope, tunnel, gangway, airway, roadway, heading or passageway, showing the full and correct conditions of the mines through which the said slope, shaft, tunnel, drift, gangway, airway, heading, passageway or other opening has been driven, what pillars of coal or other minerals, have been left, and what supports have been provided for the support of the SURFACE OF THE LAND OVER the said mines together with a map of the surface immediately over and above the same showing the extension of the operations in connection with the completion or extension of the said shaft, slope, drift, tunnel, gangway, heading, airway, roadway or passageway which said map shall also contain a certificate verified by an affidavit by the person or persons, or principal officers of the said firm or corporation FILING SAID MAP OR PLAN stating that the said map shows the true condition of the mining of the said coal or other minerals, along, in front of and adjacent to said shaft, slope, or drift, tunnel, gangway, airway or roadway, heading or passageway for which the original certificate was first obtained.

Section 4. Every person or persons, firm or corporation failing to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of Fifty Dollars per day for each and every day they shall proceed to drive any new, or extension of any old shaft, slope or drift, or any new, or the extension of any old gangway, tunnel, airway, roadway, passageway or heading below the surface of the land within the limits of the City of Pittston, not first filing a map or plan of the said proposed operation.
